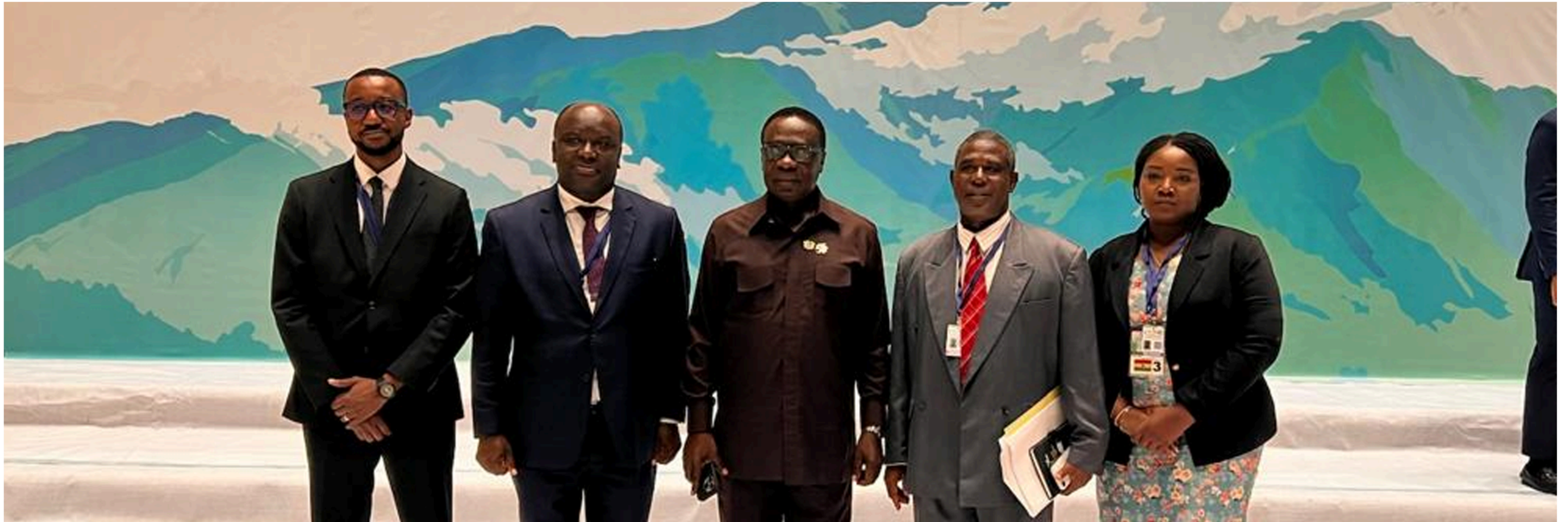

The resolution, championed by Ghana in its capacity as the African Union Champion on Reparations, provides formal recognition of the transatlantic slave trade

and economic consequences. While non-binding, the declaration encourages restorative initiatives aimed at education, cultural preservation, and community development for the descendants of enslaved Africans.

# Hohoe United withdraw from Ghana Premier League



Hohoe United has withdrawn from the 2025–2026 Ghana Premier League, citing frustration with disciplinary sanctions and perceived unfair officiating. The club faced a three-match home ban and a financial penalty after crowd misconduct incidents in March, which included objects being thrown onto the pitch and breaches of restricted areas. Hohoe United described the decision to pull out as “difficult” but

necessary, highlighting the sanctions’ negative impact on both competitive performance and revenue. The move has thrown the league into uncertainty, disrupting the competitive balance and raising questions about how fixtures, points, and standings will be adjusted mid-season.

The withdrawal underscores broader tensions in Ghanaian football over discipline, refereeing standards, and stakeholder relations. As a newly promoted team and one of the few representatives from the Volta Region, Hohoe United argued that the sanctions were excessive and inconsistently applied compared to other clubs. The Ghana Football Association now faces a governance challenge in determining whether to accept the withdrawal, engage the club in dialogue, or impose further penalties.
